Who are some populations in Region 2 that are at risk for suicide and mental health concerns that need more attention?

- Black youth (less likely to be admitted to hospital)
- LGBTQ+ youth
- Housing and security, youth,
- Hispanic youth
- Male population (80% females in MHFA)
- College aged youth
- Adolescents undergoing bullying from peers
- Special education students
- Seniors

How do we improve our outreach so that we are reaching these populations and engaging those at highest risk?

- Social media Tik Tok
- Knowledge of resources (how do we get it out there)
- Create virtual groups to youth and can be available through info. groups
- Affinity groups for LGBTQ+ specialized groups in New Haven
- Building school culture and climate survey for parents and students that lead to advisory groups to promote inclusivity
- People not connected to these settings statewide campaigns throughout the region

## **CTSAB Update**

There will be a new State Garrett Lee Smith grant for youth populations up to age 25. It
will be finalized soon with more specific details. Previous GLS grants have strived to
implement youth suicide prevention and early intervention strategies in schools,
institutions of higher education, educational institutions, juvenile justice systems,
substance use and mental health programs, foster care systems, and other child and
youth-serving organizations.

Which town or community do you believe we should focus our efforts on specifically?

- New Haven: black youth in public schools, 500 students experiencing housing instability, great partnerships to amplify for additional resources.
- Hamden: CDC-DPH previously nominated Hamden due to number of attempts and suicides from 2018-2021
- Middletown: has become more diverse, experience struggles like bigger cities, suicidal/homicidal ideations from youth, and home bound extensive outpatient.
- West Haven: high schools a lot of requests for MHFA, and one rural high school doesn't have a lot of resources like other high schools located in the city.

#### Other topics of discussion

- AFSP launches their new curriculum L.E.T.S. Save Lives for Black communities in January 2024.
- Update: APW partnered with CT Transit to promote 1 Word 1 Voice 1 Life. The bus campaign includes: 1 Word logo, APW's logo, QR code and both preventsuicidect.org and apw-ct.org websites. Located on 10 buses throughout the region. The campaign will end on Dec. 31st.

In addition to city buses and train stations, what are some additional locations/areas in the region for suicide prevention signage?

- Statewide continually thinking of ideas for locations throughout the state
- School buses magnets outside/inside buses
- Get Gizmo books into more schools (CHDI) to social workers, school personnel, etc.
- 211 distribute magnets at table events to youth
- Dog parks magnets and/or signage that will not easily come off
- Skate parks magnets or stickers
- Movie theaters printed and electronic ads for movie screens
- Youth centers YMCA Friday Night Youth Night

- RBHAOs to partner with mobile food pantries printed materials can go into bags
- Stadiums concerts, events, etc.
- Prevent Suicide CT website: available for all to order materials a way we can
  continually distribute materials from the warehouse to populations throughout the region.

Jackie shared information about an upcoming webinar, hosted with the CT Hospital Association.
