He has a passion for school safety and collaboration. Amery retired from the Westchester County Department of Public Safety in New York, where he coordinated the School Resource Officer Program. He received a master's degree in Homeland Security where his thesis focused on school safety. He received a doctorate in management with a concentration in Homeland Security where his dissertation focused on multidisciplinary school threat assessment teams. He has extensive experience in all the phases of emergency management and received his Certified Emergency Manager (CEM) designation from the International Association of Emergency Managers. Amery has published several articles on school safety and received."
